EXCLUSIVE LICENSE AGREEMENT

LICENSE TO PUBLISH

In consideration of the publication of your Article in *Key Words*, you grant to the Raymond Williams Society (RWS) for the full legal term of the copyright and any extension or renewals thereof, the exclusive licence to publish the above Article, including the rights (i) to publish, reproduce, distribute, display and store the Article worldwide in all forms, formats and media now known or as developed in the future, including print, electronic and digital forms, (ii) to translate the Article into other languages, create adaptations, summaries or extracts of the Article or other derivative works based on the Article and all provisions elaborated in (i) above shall apply in these respects, and (iii) to sub-license all such rights to others.

In the event the Article is not accepted and published by us or is withdrawn by you before acceptance by us, the assignment of rights set out in this agreement shall cease to be effective and all rights assigned by you to us in relation to the Article shall revert to you.

1 AUTHOR RIGHTS

You retain the following rights to reuse your Article without seeking permission from the Raymond Williams Society. These are rights which are personal to you and cannot be transferred by you to anyone else.

- a) the right to be identified as the Author of the Article whenever and wherever the Article is published;
- b) the right to use the Article in its published form in whole or in part without revision or modification in personal compilations in print or electronic form or other publications of an Author's own Articles, provided that full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in *Key Words* is made explicit. Where the Article is to be reprinted in a multi-Author volume published by a commercial publisher (including university presses), the permission of RWS should be sought, and a permission fee may be payable. In the event that a fee is payable this fee will be

split equally between the Author and RWS. Whether or not a fee is payable, full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in *Key Words* should be made.

- c) the right to expand an Article into book-length form for publication, provided that full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in *Key Words* is made explicit.
- d) the right to share (but not on a commercial or systematic basis) with colleagues print or electronic 'preprints' (i.e., versions of the Article created prior to peer review) and post-prints (i.e., the Article in the form accepted for publication in *Key Words* following the process of peer review) of an unpublished Article, in the form and content as submitted for publication, including the right to post such preprints and post-prints on your own website, or on your institution's intranet, but not for commercial sale or for any systematic external distribution by a third party (for example a listserv or database connected to a public access server). You should include the following acknowledgement:

For the avoidance of doubt, you are not permitted to post the PDF version of the Article prepared by us on any publicly available website, although you may share with colleagues (but not on a commercial or systematic basis) copies of an Article in its published form as supplied by RWS as an electronic or printed offprint or reprint.

- e) the right to make printed copies of all or part of an Article for use by you for lecture or classroom purposes provided that such copies are not offered for sale or distributed in any systematic way, and provided that full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in the *Key Words* is made explicit. For the avoidance of doubt, Authors may use the PDF version in teaching and for coursepacks within their own institution, including on a restricted-access institutional intranet, so long as they are distributed free of charge and not sold to students.
- f) the right to deposit the final version of the Article (but not the RWS-supplied PDF file) in your institution's electronic depository.
- g) the right to include the Article in a thesis or dissertation that is not to be published commercially, provided that full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in *Key Words* is made explicit.
- h) the right to present the Article at a meeting or conference and to distribute printed copies of the Article to the delegates attending the meeting provided that this is not for commercial purposes and provided that full bibliographic acknowledgement to prior publication in *Key Words* is made explicit.

2 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE RAYMOND WILLIAMS SOCIETY

We shall prepare and publish your Article in the Journal. We reserve the right to make such editorial changes as may be necessary to make the Article suitable for publication, or as we reasonably consider necessary to avoid infringing third party rights or law; and we reserve the right not to proceed with publication for whatever reason.

3 MORAL RIGHTS

You hereby assert your moral rights to be identified as the Author of the Article according to the UK Copyright Designs & Patents Act 1988.

4 AUTHOR WARRANTIES

- a) You hereby warrant that you have secured the necessary written permission from the appropriate copyright owner or Authorities for the reproduction in the Article and in the Journal of any text, illustration, or other material.
- b) You warrant that, apart from any such third party copyright material included in the Article, the Article is your original work, and does not infringe the intellectual property rights of any other person or entity and cannot be construed as plagiarising any other published work.
- c) You further warrant that the Article is not currently under submission to, nor is under consideration by or has been accepted by any other journal or publication, nor has been previously assigned or licensed by you to any third party.
- d) Without prejudice to the Author Rights detailed above you undertake that the fully reference-linked version of scholarly record will not be published elsewhere without our prior written consent.
- e) In addition you warrant that the Article contains no statement that is abusive, defamatory, libelous, obscene, fraudulent, nor in any way infringes the rights of others, nor is in any other way unlawful or in violation of applicable laws.
- f) You undertake that you will keep RWS indemnified in full against all loss, damages, injury, costs and expenses (including legal and other professional fees and expenses) awarded against or incurred or paid by us as a result of your breach of the warranties given in this agreement.
- g) If the Article was prepared jointly with other Authors, you warrant that you have been Authorized by all co-Authors to sign this Agreement on their behalf, and to agree on their behalf the order of names in the publication of the Article. You shall notify us in writing of the names of any such co-Authors.

5 GOVERNING LAW

This agreement (and any dispute, proceeding, claim or controversy in relation to it) is subject to English law and the jurisdiction of the Courts of England and Wales. It may only be amended by a document signed by both of us.
